HISTORIC RCA STUDIO B

Experience music history up close at the "Home of 1,000 Hits"

NESTLED ON FAMED MUSIC ROW, Historic RCA Studio B is the oldest surviving recording studio in Nashville and one of the most famous studios in the world.

From 1957 to 1977 the magic of Studio B lent itself to the recording of more than 35,000 songs. Nearly 1,000 became Top Ten hits. "Are You Lonesome Tonight?" by Elvis Presley, "Kiss an Angel Good Morning" by Charley Pride, "Only the Lonely" by Roy Orbison and "I Will Always Love You" by Dolly Parton are just a few of the milestone recordings that were born at Studio B.

Celebrating over 50 years of music history, Historic RCA Studio B provides a glimpse into the heart of Nashville music-making during one of its most exciting and classic periods.

HISTORIC RCA STUDIO B TOUR*

Groups enjoy a guided tour while the voices of legends like Dolly Parton, Charley Pride and the Jordanaires' Ray Walker recall the studio's history. As your group is guided through the studio, they will view vintage film footage, artifacts, photos and the original instruments featured on many hit recordings. *Duration: 1 hour*

STAR FOR A DAY*

The star treatment begins on Music Row at Historic RCA Studio B. Here your group will be personally guided and given insight about the stars and hits that were recorded there. Then, your group will step up to the microphone and be professionally recorded in a choir-style setup in the same studio used by music's biggest stars. At the end of the session, group members can purchase a keepsake CD of the recording.

The excursion ends at the world-famous Wildhorse Saloon for a barbecue buffet, line-dancing lessons, and a "listen" to their new single. Be a hit with your group by making them a "Star for a Day." *Duration: 2 ½ hours*

STORIES BEHIND THE SONGS*

Learn the stories behind the music you love in a private session with one of Nashville's hit-making songwriters. This intimate session allows your group the rare opportunity to hear hits as they were originally written. The writer demonstrates to the group how a song is created from concept to hit. Each session ends with a meet-and-greet, in which the writer signs autographs, answers questions and has recordings available for purchase. *Duration: 1 hour*

SHARING THE ART OF SONGWRITING*

Ever wonder if you have what it takes to write a song? Now you can find out. This session is an interactive hour in which your group acts as the co-writer to a song with one of Music City's accomplished songwriters. The writer guides the group in coming up with ideas and composing original lyrics. The session concludes with the songwriter performing Nashville's newest tune. You won't find another experience for your group that's more uniquely Nashville. *Duration: 1 hour*

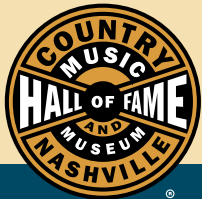

LIMITED ENGAGEMENT EXHIBITS



March 28, 2008 – December 31, 2009

Few families have had such a major impact on country music as the Williamses. This 5,000 square foot major exhibition examines the personal lives of Hank Williams and Hank Williams Jr. and explores the behind-the-scenes dynamics that inspired some of the most influential country music ever recorded. To tell the story, Hank Williams Jr., Jett Williams and members of the Williams family have offered rare artifacts never seen by the public, enabling the museum to create an unforgettably compelling saga of love, heartache and redemption.



August 2008 – June 2009

This intimate exhibit examines Kitty Wells's transition from "girl singer" to bonafide country music star—blazing a trail followed by artists such as Patsy Cline, Loretta Lynn, and Reba McEntire. Her breakthrough hit, "It Wasn't God Who Made Honky Tonk Angels," gave voice to a woman's perspective and launched Wells on a course that would earn her a Grammy Lifetime Achievement Award and membership in the Country Music Hall of Fame.

Brenda Lee is one of the most beloved entertainers in the world, selling millions of records and contributing standards such as "I'm Sorry" and "Rockin' Around the Christmas Tree."
